Awarded annually since 1976, the Topaz Medallion celebrates the importance of educators in shaping the lives and careers of architects.

Eligibility

Individuals, who must be living at the time of nomination, who have spent at least a decade primarily involved in architectural education, and whose primary contributions to architectural education has been on the North American continent are eligible to be nominated. Any colleague, student, or former student may nominate candidates for the Topaz Medallion.
